66 Pillow Cases were donated for Hospice plus 36 gowns that Karen Schlup made with fabric and bias tape donated by Janet Loveless.

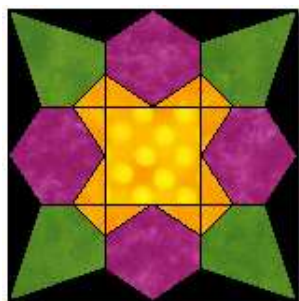
Almost 100 pillows for women with Breast Cancer were donated and more are coming in. The women as well as the medical staff are very appreciative.

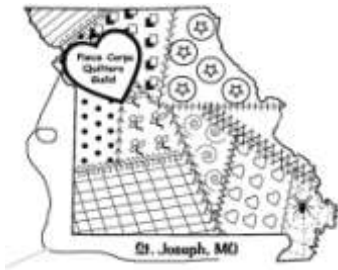

**JANUARY MEETING**

The next meeting for the Piece Corps Quilters Guild will be **Monday, January 3, 2011.**

The **January** program will be a Valentine 2.5" strip exchange and Patchwork Hearts by Dedra Litherland. To participate in the strip exchange, you need one yard of predominantly red fabric, OR one yard of predominantly pink fabric, OR one yard of predominantly white fabric that is cut into 2.5" strips across the width of fabric. This results in 14 strips of fabric (2.5" x approximately 42"). If you want, you can bring more than one SET of strips (14 strips) to exchange.
