Hostesses were Karen Leake, Barb Miller, and Jennifer Sprague. Vicki Jackson and Carla Proctor were greeters. The roll call was "What is your favorite quilt you own or would like to own?"

The February Minutes were corrected – the Des Moines trip is the first weekend in October 7th and 8th, 2010.

Old business

Raffle quilt The quilt will be displayed at the Pony Express Museum this month and the drawing for the raffle will be at the May meeting of the quilt guild.

Nancy Root reported that the guild web site had received 50 hits after the article in the paper and the newsletter went out.

If you want to receive your newsletter by e-mail Debby Hanlan, editor sent a sign up sheet around.

The members of the Quilt Show committee hung about 78 quilts this morning at the Wyeth Tootle Museum . Tomorrow they will hang quilts at the Pony Express Museum and Wednesday at the Saint Joseph Museum on Frederick . Quilts will be picked up at the Mansion April 9 at 10:00 AM , the Pony Express Museum at 2:00 that day, and April 12 at 10:00 at the Museum on Frederick .

Susan Dudley and Cira Wright are collecting boutique items and will take them to the museums.

Charity projects

Kelley Lacina reported that four ideas for charity projects for next year had been submitted.

1. Quilts for veterans
2. Participating in the 1,000,000,000 pillowcases challenge
3. Ronald McDonald House at Mercy Hospital
4. Royal Family Kids Camp (about 25 abused or neglected kids at Farwesta).



Those submitting the suggestions briefly explained the projects and written ballots were distributed with members asked to identify their top three choices. Instead of working on several projects at once the project with the most votes will be completed, then number two, etc. If a group from the Guild would like to get together and work on other projects they are encouraged to do so.

Ways and Means Susan encouraged the members to sell raffle tickets for the quilt at the Pony Express Museum and to provide boutique items for the museums.

Charity After counting the ballots quilts for either children or adults for the Ronald McDonald House at Mercy Hospital was number one, second was quilts for Veterans, and third was the Royal Family Kids Camp.

Program The Programs for the coming year are listed in the Year Books that were available at the meeting. It is recommended that the Program Committee be appointed earlier next year.

Publicity Kathryn Stevenson reported that a member of the Guild will be on Live at Five Friday at 5:00 to publicize the show at the museums.

Spring Retreat Vicki Jackson reminded those who will be attending that they will meet after the guild meeting.

Donna Snyder will be having hip replacement surgery this Friday.

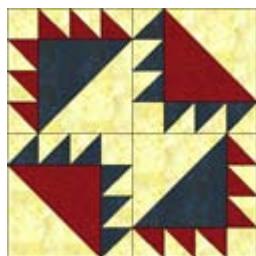
March meeting program
