The April meeting of the Piece Corps Quilters Guild was called to order at 7:00 pm by the President, Pat Meyer at the Community Presbyterian Church. There were 41 members and no guests present. Hostesses were Laveta Bunse, Emma Kern, and Karen Vulgamott; Susan Dudley was the greeter. The Roll Call was "What is your name and how many quilts have you made and kept?"

Old Business

RAFFLE \$359 has been received from Raffle Tickets sold for the quilt; an additional \$50 is anticipated from sales at the museum. Since the quilt cost \$190 (backing and quilting were donated) all members were encouraged to sell more tickets. The drawing will be at the May meeting.

QUILT SHOW Quilts should be picked up at the Mansion Friday at 10:00 am. (Quilts from the Frederick Avenue museum will be brought to the Mansion.) Kathy Reno with the museum requested that two years from now the quilt show be at the mansion for six weeks. There are lots of people who come to the Mansion just for the quilts. (A group from Kansas City will be there April 6.) Judy O'Donnell suggested that there be only one location at a time. She also suggested that the Guild do the show to get the revenue from the show.

New Business

Living Community has requested a program. Dedra Litherland and Pat Meyer will do a trunk show in May and explain the new techniques in quilting.

All members were reminded to wear their handmade nametags to the meetings.

Fons and Porter are sponsoring a quilt retreat in Branson June 3 to 7. It will be on appliqué. Anyone who refers three quilting buddies will get a discount on their fees.

The President reminded hostesses that plates, cups, and plastic ware are available in the meeting room cabinet.

Committee Reports

Ways and Means Susan Dudley again reminded the members to sell raffle tickets! There were 185 bazaar items at the museum, 41 sold for an estimated \$150. Susan moved bringing the items back to the guild and selling them at a meeting. Diana Garret seconded the motion and it passed.

Courtesy Carolyn Alexander reported that Donna Snyder thanked the guild for her daisy bouquet and that she was now going to require surgery on her elbow. Susan Dudley sent a thank you to the guild for the carnation bud base. Carolyn apologized to Barbara Wilkerson for not acknowledging Barbara's Father's death.

Charity Kelly Lacina announced a work day Saturday, June 5, at the Agency Methodist Church to work on quilts for Mercy Hospital. Three patterns were suggested, a rectangle pattern for adult lap quilts, and either paper pieced ice cream cones or kites for children. (Or guild members may use a pattern of their choice.) Materials lists will be provided at the next meeting and the workday will include a "mini workshop" on paper piecing.
