Thread moments by Judy O'Donnell: Invisible thread is perfect for quilting around applique and quilting in the ditch. To successfully use invisible thread you need to loosen the tension. To test tension, thread normally flows easily thru the needle. Pull on thread tail hard and then let go. If thread snaps into a corkscrew the tension is too tight. Loosen till thread no longer curls. This lets you know the thread is not stretching. Invisible thread has changed over the years. Give it a try.
