Minutes

September 12, 2016, 6:00 p.m.

Call to order: Following the program "Donna Does It This Way" presented by Donna deNatale of Lenexa, KS, the meeting was called to order at the Pony Express Museum by President Lanette Bocquin.

Minutes: A motion to correct the August 2016 minutes as follows was made: The quilt tops made by Kay Huntsman had guild labels and were donated to Quilts of Valor. Motion to approve minutes of August 2016 meeting as amended was made and seconded. Motion passed.

Treasury Report: Treasury Report was presented by Theresa Culver. The ending balance was \$8,870.75. Motion to approve was moved and seconded. Motion passed.

New Business: A ballot with several ideas for Mini-Workshops and Professional classes was distributed by the special committee which is working on this. Anne Deguchi announced the results. Professional class: Bargello. Mini-Workshop: Paper Piecing, Applique, Swoon, Twister.

Judy O'Donnell had the shirts ready for pick up this evening. She announced that the committee forgot to add sales tax to the price of the shirt when they announced it to the club. She said the tax was about \$1 per shirt. A motion to have each member pay an additional \$1 to cover the tax was moved and seconded. Motion passed. Members are to give the \$1 to Judy.

Linda Bennett announced that the Albert Kemper Museum of Art is having a Christmas tree silent auction as part of its annual Sugar Plum Festival fundraiser. She suggested that the guild decorate and donate a tree. It would require a 4' tree and about two dozen quilted ornaments. It has to be completed by early November. Bobbie suggested using some of the left over ornaments from the quilt show. A motion to decorate and donate a tree was made and seconded. Motion passed.
