Charity:

Charity Items delivered in April were 31 hospice gowns to Mosaic Hospice, 12 Quillows to YWCA, and 5 burp pads, 12 receiving blankets, 3 baby quilts and 2 lap quilts to Catholic Charities. Thanks to Mary Gaston for quilting one of the baby quilts. Carl Hentsch donated enough fabric to make 4 quilts for charity. The Guild will buy backing and batting and will be asking for volunteers to quilt. Linda Benitz, Marilyn Fagan, Raylene Mason & Karen Moore each took fabric and will work within groups to make the quilt tops. Murla Leahy suggested that the guild make tie quilts since we are limited on machine quilters. Kathy Stockett suggested using sheets as batting. Terry Peppers has flannel for self-binding quilts already cut, please help.

Ways & Means: A meeting will be held on May 17th at 4:30 at the Pony Express Museum for committee heads of the Quilt Show, anyone is welcome to attend. Carlene is looking for 4-5 picnic quilts to use in decorations at the show. Bobbi Foster reported that guild member Carl Hentsch donated 15 pillows and 3 quilts to the guild. The pillows will be sold in the boutique at the quilt show and 2 of the quilts will be used as opportunity quilts at the show.

Quilt Racks: Terry Peppers reported on the purchase of Quilt racks for the guild to be used in the Quilt show. A vote was taken and approved to spend up to \$1000 on making the racks. Terry Peppers and Bev Lowry's husbands have been volunteered to make the racks. They will be making the racks the same size as the quilt racks that we will be renting from the Smithville Guild. Drury Inn will be donating white sheets to be used on the racks.

Bus Trip: Karen Leake and Mary Gaston reported on the Guild Bus trip on August 3rd & 4th to the International Quilt Museum in Lincoln Ne and to 5 area quilt shops. The guild will pay the estimated \$2,100 to \$2,500 cost for the bus. It is estimated that each guild member's cost will be around \$100 which will pay for hotel rooms, cost of tours at the museum and extras. Hotels will be 2 people per room with 2 beds in each room. Price does not include lunches, dinner or fabric. This price is based on filling up the 56 seats on the bus. If all seats are not filled by July 2nd, members will be able to invite guests at a cost of \$145.00 per person. Quilts shops to be visited are the Cosmic Cow & Calico House in Lincoln, Quilted Moose in Gretna, Country Traditions in Fremont & the Country Sampler in Omaha. Deadline to pay is July 2nd.

The meeting was adjourned, followed by show and tell. Guild members are asked to be respectful and abstain from conversations during show & Tell and Programs.
